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CONSULTANCY POLICY

Dr. Moonje Institute of Management & Computer Studies, Nashik believes that higher educational institutions have a role in the growth and development of the local community and thereby in the nation building process. Educational institutions play a vital role in strengthening institutions, industries and governmental organizations by dissemination of appropriate information, knowledge and technology possessed or developed by its staff.

Consultancy is an important channel through which knowledge and expertise could flow from institute to local businesses and other external agencies, and it cancontribute to the growth, development and productive relationships with these components of society. Consultancy activity in Institute may be associated with contractual relationships, including research, service contracts etc. with government non-government organization in lieu of a fee.

Consultancy and professional activity is to help improve management systems in work organisations and thus acquire valuable insights in knowledge application and problems solving. These insights acquired by the faculty are the greatest asset for them to improve their class room engagements, designing new training programmes and publish research articles. The institute, therefore, encourages its faculty and staff to engage in consultancy wherever appropriate, and in a manner that is in conformity with their service agreement with the institute and without creating conflict of interest. In order to administer the consultancy practice and ensure equity, the following guidelines are prepared and published.



Consultancy-Meaning and Scope

The objective of Consultancy Policy is to promote academic, industry and research interaction and to encourage and facilitate faculty to provide knowledge inputs sought by industry, government agencies or other academic /research organizations. Consultancy is well recognized as an effective way for educational institutions to disseminate knowledge and make an early and direct impact on society. How- ever, the balance between consultancy and the traditional roles of the academic staff needs to be man- aged and the interests of the institute must be protected. This Policy provides provisions for conducting consultancy to ensure that consultancies undertaken by staff are consistent with the institute's strategic and operational objectives and the costs are sustainable.

The influence of higher educational capital on society is predominant and the availability of this capital is prerequisite for development. Over the years, globally there is an increased focus on this capital, which spurs innovation, invention, critical thinking and a source of knowledge base for the society. The higher educational institutions are the nurturers of this capital, the fame and recognition of these learning centers rests on its high-quality research, experiments, and other academic endeavors

The Essential Features of Consultancy are:

- Consultancy is work of a professional nature, undertaken by the faculty members in their field of expertise, for clients outside the institution, for which some financial return is provided.
- There should be demonstrable benefit to the institute from the consultancy through income,en-hanced reputation,and/or expanding the expertise of the staff member.
- The Consultancy must not be in conflict with the institute policies including those governing employ- ment; such as the Code of Conduct Policy
- The Consultancy must not be in conflict with the functions, objectives or interests of the institute or damage the institute's reputation.
- Unlike research it does not have as a prime purpose the generation of new knowledge.
- Consultancy will produce some form of contracted output which may be partly or wholly owned by the client
- It tends to be governed by short-term contracts, makes minimal use of institute resources and involves extra work for existing faculty members rather than the employment of new staff.



Consultation Activities:

- Following activities will fall under the consultancy
- Development of a product/part of product or services for any individual industry or organization external to the institute shall fall under consultancy where one or more staff works for such development for a pre agreed cost and period.
- Modification, augmentation or alteration of any product or process or services where one or more staff extend their active participation for such job.
- Any kind of professional advice given by one or more staff to external organization/firm/individual for a pre decided cost and time.
- Any research work undertaken by one or more staff for any external individual or organization to develop product or process or services.
- Conduct of any special courses, chairing/participation in organized activities, delivery expert advice/
- Discourse for a fee to any outside organization/individual.
- Any royalty of fees received for any Intellectual Property by a staff and any fees received from out-side.

Exclusions:

- This policy does not apply to those activities, paid or unpaid, which are in furtherance of scholarship or general dissemination of knowledge, such as:
- Authorship of,or royalties from,the publication of books
- > External examiner duties
- Study tours and conference presentations or participation
- Editorship of academic journals or the publication of academic articles
- Delivered special lectures, Participation in University councils, Institute and Public Service Commission Selection Committees and membership of Board of Directors of Companies are not included in consultancy services.

Approval of Consultancy Activity:

Institute may receive Consultancy Projects in three ways

- I. An individual faculty, through his stature, contacts and connection gets assignments from outside clients
- 2. The Department collectively promote themselves and get offers of Training, workshops from Gov- ernment or other outside agencies.
- 3. External agencies approach the institute with specific consultancy proposal. The approval process is different for different situations.

Code of Conducts:-

- The conduct of the employee during the consultancy work must conform to the honour and reputation of the institute. The institute will be entitled to take disciplinary action against its employee for any misconduct during the consultancy.
- Staff should not enter into any contractual arrangements or agreements themselves. This is a re-quirement of these procedures and is in the professional interests of the member of staff. All Con-sultancies related agreements or contracts will be between the Institute and the client. The standard Consultancy Services Agreements supplied by Research & Consultancy Cell should be used in all practicable circumstances where possible. The
- Institute can be represented by the Director or any other person authorised by the Director can only sign such agreements.
- Original copies of all documents related to all consultancy services undertaken by its employee must be in possession of the institute for allowing appropriate processing for financial accounting and audit purposes.
- The clients receiving consultancy services would not be entitled to use the Institute name,logo etc.in any form without prior permission of the Director.
- Engagement in consultancies must not create any perceived or actual conflict of interest, Conflict of interest, if any, must be immediately reported to the Director.



DISCLAIMERS

It is the responsibility of each member of staff to familiarise themselves with the Consultancy Policy and Procedures and ensure they comply with its processes and procedures. It is the responsibility of each Consultant to ensure that the Institute should be properly acknowledged in publications produced out of the results of the Institutional Consultancy and also that a copy of the published work should be submitted to the Institute. Any disputes arising between the institute and clients shall be filed in and settled exclusively by the Courts in Nashik



Impacts /Outcomes of Activity: We are, therefore, taking the liberty of presenting an alternative policy, which has as its thrust the genuine involvement of communities and people in the manage- ment of water resources, government. Such initiatives will help maintain the groundwater level.

Resources: Tree Plantation, Teaching Aids for School Children, Human Resource (Student Team, Karyakarta Team),

Problems Identified: The population is migrating for employment during dry season as there is no water available during rabbi season. In remote tribal areas rainfall is still an issue of low water base in summer and sometimes to get drinking water becomes itself question mark. Since farming based on rain water is not enough. This water problem creates large-scale migration.





Introduction: Shramanubhav Shibir is one of the distinctive characteristic programs at our institution, in collaboration with Volunteer Organisation Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram. Shramanubhav Shibir provides solutions by storing rainwater above the ground in natural through check dams and also constructing artificial reservoirs, cement dam. There is an acute shortage of even drinking water during the summer in a majority of tribal villages of Peth Taluka Nashik District.

Process: We have formed a team to understand the community problems from Tribal Areas in Nashik District in our institution. Shramanubhav Shbir bring the students and community on the same platform to know the problem and to develop a design to address the problem, which fulfills the needs of the community.

Support: As part of our social contribution our students organizing Shibir of two day. During two day of Shibir our students construct a small check dam with the help Engineers Group of Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram, Villagers Officials and Employees of Forest Department, Government of Maharashtra Students from a B-School are taking such efforts for the betterment of tribal people by working in unfavorable conditions.

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








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

Preamble

In November 2016, All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) released a Start- up Policy document for AICTE approved institutions, to address the need of inculcating innovation and entrepreneurial culture in higher education institutions (HEIs). The policy primarily focused on guiding the AICTE approved institutions in implementing Start-up Action Plan of Government of India.

The Government of Maharashtra also released the Maharashtra State Innovative Startup Policy 2018 with an aim to nurture innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem in the State as it is imperative to nurture innovation and lateral thinking at college level. In February 2019, Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) along with AICTE and MHRD's Innovation Cell (MIC), released the "National Innovation and Start-up Policy (NISP) 2019" for students and faculty of HEIs.

Based on the above policies, Dr. Moonje Institute of Management & Computer Studies (DMIMCS) have framed the DMIMCS Innovation and Startup Policy to cater to innovation and entrepreneurial needs of its students, faculty and staff.

Vision

The Institute Startup and Innovation Policy aims to cater the needs of Management Student entrepreneurs with innovative ideas of business as well as social importance and there by introducing a culture of entrepreneurship inside educational campus which will strengthen our educational environment and there by promoting the national economical and social development

Mission

To develop an environment that can facilitate students and faculty members to innovate and prototype their potential ideas with business importance and support from the Government, industries and NGOs to help them and appreciate their caliber

Policy Statement

To provide guidelines for creating a system for fostering innovation and entrepreneur mindset among Students and Faculty that promotes the Startups which benefits the society and nation.

Policy Objectives

Short term Objectives

To help students to prototype their business ideas.

To facilitate the innovation and creative thinking among students.

To promote the innovative mindset among the faculty members.

To Strengthen institute industry interaction

To conduct Workshops, Experts Talks, FDP etc. for students & Faculty promote entrepreneurial culture.

Long Term Objectives

To provide a platform for students and faculty for developing innovative products with global recognition.

To improve quality of research work among students and to attain patent that can be commercially viable.

To generate revenues through the consultancy projects and student startups.

Strategies and Governance

- a. Entrepreneurship promotion and development is one of the major dimensions of the Institute strategy. To facilitate development of an entrepreneurial ecosystem in the institute, specific objectives and associated performance indicators are defined for assessment.
- Implementation of entrepreneurial vision at the institute should be achieved through mission statements.
- The institute supports incubation infrastructure and facilities by resource mobilization.
- d. Institute raise funding through sponsorships and donations by actively engaging alumni network for promoting Innovation & Entrepreneurship (I&E).
- d. For accelerating the decision making, hierarchical barriers were minimized and individual autonomy and ownership of initiatives was promoted.
- e. Innovation and entrepreneurial program get promote at various institutional programs such as conferences, workshops, seminars etc.
- f. DMIMCS student and faculty startup policy formulated at institute level, which is in line with the NISP-2019 along with well-defined short-term and long-term objectives.
- g. The development of entrepreneurship is not limited within the boundaries of the institution as the institute also giving an opportunity for regional startups, provision to extend facilities for outsiders.
- h. Strategic international partnerships developed using bilateral and multilateral channels with international innovation clusters and other relevant organizations.

Startups Enabling Institutional Infrastructure

- Infrastructural support in terms of working space, institutional security and availability of computing facility.
- Co-working Space: Well designed and furnished workspace Incubation sections are available for the Incubate.
- The Incubation units are designed with plug and play facility with high speed wireless and wired connectivity.
- Meeting and conference rooms are available for brainstorming and discussions.
- Meeting rooms with audio and video conference facilities are available and can be booked online.
- Auditorium facility of DMIMCS can be utilized by Start-up as per the availability.
- Dedicated Innovation Cell with software for developing the prototyping is available.
- A well-established library services are accessible with access to international journals and online database, Photocopier, office phones etc.

Nurturing Innovations and Startups

- DMIMCS facilitates the start-up activities/ technology development by allowing students and faculty to use institute infrastructure and facilities, as per the choice of the potential entrepreneur.
- DMIMCS facilitates part-time entrepreneurship training.
- DMIMCS facilitates Mentorship support on regular basis.
- DMIMCS facilitates technology guidance, ideation, creativity, design thinking, development, R & D Support, fund raising, new venture planning, business development, product development, social entrepreneurship etc.
- DMIMCS provide well-trained students will be made available as interns.

Norms for the Faculty and Students Startups

For Faculty

- DMIMCS provides space, infrastructure, mentorship support etc. for the Startup Company owned by Faculty and staff.
- If a faculty member is an Owner or Co-owner of such companies with the permission of the Institute and be a Director on the Board, he / she may also play an operational role with the approval of the Institute
- In case the faculty member holds the executive or managerial position for more than six months in a startup company, they should be on sabbatical /leave without pay/ or utilize existing leave.
- Other Faculty members may undertake projects from the company owned by a faculty member following the Institute norms of consultancy projects that prevails.
- A Company owned or co-owned by a faculty member will normally be required to incubate at the Institute incubator.

For Students

- DMIMCS allow students to establish Startup or working part time for the startup already present with the Institute Incubator while studying / working as intern.
- The Students may be allowed to earn credits for working on innovative prototypes/Business Models.
- The Students may be allowed to opt for start-up in place of their mini project/ major project, seminars, summer trainings with the prior approval.
- Students may be permitted to use the startup idea / prototype development as their major project work for the Institute academic requirements.
- Institute may allow their students to take a semester/year break to work on their Startups and re-join the classes.
- Students entrepreneurs are allow appearing for the examination, even if their attendance is less than the minimum permissible percentage by institute and as per the Regulations of the university.

Intellectual Property Rights Protection and licensing

Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) denotes the specific legal rights of the inventors to hold and exercise Patents, Trademarks, Copyrights, Industrial Designs, etc. IPR aims to exclude third parties from exploiting the protected subject matter for a certain period of time (normally 20 years), without explicit authorization from the right holders. The IPR developed by the Institute / startup has to be protected and licensed as per the Institute norms.

The students and faculty members intending to initiate a start-up based on the technology developed or co-developed by them or the technology owned by the institute, will be allowed to take a license on the said technology on easy term, either in terms of equity in the venture and/or license fees and/or royalty to obviate the early stage financial burden. When institute facilities / funds are used substantially or when IPR is developed as a part of curriculum/academic activity, IPR is to be jointly owned by inventors and the institute.

Monitoring

The implementation of the policy is the responsibility of Head of Institute and institute must provide support mechanisms and guidance for creating, managing and coordinating these relationships. Impact assessment of Institute's entrepreneurial initiatives should be performed regularly using evaluation parameters such as Number of Workshops, conferences conducted etc. The number of startups generated, the institutional level support system, participant satisfaction, and new business contacts formed by the institutes should all be tracked. The success of the policy should be measured in terms of the market's technological, social, and sustainable economic effects.

Preamble

In November 2016, All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) released a Start- up Policy document for AICTE approved institutions, to address the need of inculcating innovation and entrepreneurial culture in higher education institutions (HEIs). The policy primarily focused on guiding the AICTE approved institutions in implementing Start-up Action Plan of Government of India.

The Government of Maharashtra also released the Maharashtra State Innovative Startup Policy 2018 with an aim to nurture innovation and entrepreneurship ecosystem in the State as it is imperative to nurture innovation and lateral thinking at college level. In February 2019, Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) along with AICTE and MHRD's Innovation Cell (MIC), released the "National Innovation and Start-up Policy (NISP) 2019" for students and faculty of HEIs.

Based on the above policies, Dr. Moonje Institute of Management & Computer Studies (DMIMCS) have framed the DMIMCS Innovation and Startup Policy to cater to innovation and entrepreneurial needs of its students, faculty and staff.

Vision

The Institute Startup and Innovation Policy aims to cater the needs of Management Student entrepreneurs with innovative ideas of business as well as social importance and there by introducing a culture of entrepreneurship inside educational campus which will strengthen our educational environment and there by promoting the national economical and social development

Mission

To develop an environment that can facilitate students and faculty members to innovate and prototype their potential ideas with business importance and support from the Government, industries and NGOs to help them and appreciate their caliber

Policy Statement

To provide guidelines for creating a system for fostering innovation and entrepreneur mindset among Students and Faculty that promotes the Startups which benefits the society and nation.

Policy Objectives

Short term Objectives

To help students to prototype their business ideas.

To facilitate the innovation and creative thinking among students.

To promote the innovative mindset among the faculty members.

To Strengthen institute industry interaction

To conduct Workshops, Experts Talks, FDP etc. for students & Faculty promote entrepreneurial culture.

Long Term Objectives

To provide a platform for students and faculty for developing innovative products with global recognition.

To improve quality of research work among students and to attain patent that can be commercially viable.

To generate revenues through the consultancy projects and student startups.

Strategies and Governance

- a. Entrepreneurship promotion and development is one of the major dimensions of the Institute strategy. To facilitate development of an entrepreneurial ecosystem in the institute, specific objectives and associated performance indicators are defined for assessment.
- Implementation of entrepreneurial vision at the institute should be achieved through mission statements.
- The institute supports incubation infrastructure and facilities by resource mobilization.
- d. Institute raise funding through sponsorships and donations by actively engaging alumni network for promoting Innovation & Entrepreneurship (I&E).
- d. For accelerating the decision making, hierarchical barriers were minimized and individual autonomy and ownership of initiatives was promoted.
- e. Innovation and entrepreneurial program get promote at various institutional programs such as conferences, workshops, seminars etc.
- f. DMIMCS student and faculty startup policy formulated at institute level, which is in line with the NISP-2019 along with well-defined short-term and long-term objectives.
- g. The development of entrepreneurship is not limited within the boundaries of the institution as the institute also giving an opportunity for regional startups, provision to extend facilities for outsiders.
- h. Strategic international partnerships developed using bilateral and multilateral channels with international innovation clusters and other relevant organizations.

Startups Enabling Institutional Infrastructure

- Infrastructural support in terms of working space, institutional security and availability of computing facility.
- Co-working Space: Well designed and furnished workspace Incubation sections are available for the Incubate.
- The Incubation units are designed with plug and play facility with high speed wireless and wired connectivity.
- Meeting and conference rooms are available for brainstorming and discussions.
- Meeting rooms with audio and video conference facilities are available and can be booked online.
- Auditorium facility of DMIMCS can be utilized by Start-up as per the availability.
- Dedicated Innovation Cell with software for developing the prototyping is available.
- A well-established library services are accessible with access to international journals and online database, Photocopier, office phones etc.

Nurturing Innovations and Startups

- DMIMCS facilitates the start-up activities/ technology development by allowing students and faculty to use institute infrastructure and facilities, as per the choice of the potential entrepreneur.
- DMIMCS facilitates part-time entrepreneurship training.
- DMIMCS facilitates Mentorship support on regular basis.
- DMIMCS facilitates technology guidance, ideation, creativity, design thinking, development, R & D Support, fund raising, new venture planning, business development, product development, social entrepreneurship etc.
- DMIMCS provide well-trained students will be made available as interns.

Norms for the Faculty and Students Startups

For Faculty

- DMIMCS provides space, infrastructure, mentorship support etc. for the Startup Company owned by Faculty and staff.
- If a faculty member is an Owner or Co-owner of such companies with the permission of the Institute and be a Director on the Board, he / she may also play an operational role with the approval of the Institute
- In case the faculty member holds the executive or managerial position for more than six months in a startup company, they should be on sabbatical /leave without pay/ or utilize existing leave.
- Other Faculty members may undertake projects from the company owned by a faculty member following the Institute norms of consultancy projects that prevails.
- A Company owned or co-owned by a faculty member will normally be required to incubate at the Institute incubator.

For Students

- DMIMCS allow students to establish Startup or working part time for the startup already present with the Institute Incubator while studying / working as intern.
- The Students may be allowed to earn credits for working on innovative prototypes/Business Models.
- The Students may be allowed to opt for start-up in place of their mini project/ major project, seminars, summer trainings with the prior approval.
- Students may be permitted to use the startup idea / prototype development as their major project work for the Institute academic requirements.
- Institute may allow their students to take a semester/year break to work on their Startups and re-join the classes.
- Students entrepreneurs are allow appearing for the examination, even if their attendance is less than the minimum permissible percentage by institute and as per the Regulations of the university.

Intellectual Property Rights Protection and licensing

Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) denotes the specific legal rights of the inventors to hold and exercise Patents, Trademarks, Copyrights, Industrial Designs, etc. IPR aims to exclude third parties from exploiting the protected subject matter for a certain period of time (normally 20 years), without explicit authorization from the right holders. The IPR developed by the Institute / startup has to be protected and licensed as per the Institute norms.

The students and faculty members intending to initiate a start-up based on the technology developed or co-developed by them or the technology owned by the institute, will be allowed to take a license on the said technology on easy term, either in terms of equity in the venture and/or license fees and/or royalty to obviate the early stage financial burden. When institute facilities / funds are used substantially or when IPR is developed as a part of curriculum/academic activity, IPR is to be jointly owned by inventors and the institute.

Monitoring

The implementation of the policy is the responsibility of Head of Institute and institute must provide support mechanisms and guidance for creating, managing and coordinating these relationships. Impact assessment of Institute's entrepreneurial initiatives should be performed regularly using evaluation parameters such as Number of Workshops, conferences conducted etc. The number of startups generated, the institutional level support system, participant satisfaction, and new business contacts formed by the institutes should all be tracked. The success of the policy should be measured in terms of the market's technological, social, and sustainable economic effects.

The DMI Research Centre wants to encourage its students to explore intercollegiate research opportunities and publish original work in leading journals or present such work at state level- national level- international level conferences.


The DMI Research Centre will organize Academic Writing workshops for faculty as well as students to enable them augment their writing and analytical skills and also encourage for attending online courses for the same.




